Germany



2nd Shitoryu summercamp at Freizeitcenter Oberrhein from 1st August to 8th August 2009

Expectations were high among the karateka's from Löchgau and Beilstein and their families when they pitched their tents for the second Shitoryu Summercamp at Freizeitcenter Oberrhein (near Baden-Baden, Germany).

They reminisced about last year's strenuous training lessons, refreshing baths in the lake and delicious BBQs in the evenings. Once again, they were not disappointed. The capricious German summer seemed to make a real effort, and so the sunny weather contributed to everyone's high spirits. Old friendships were cemented and new friendships were formed when the karateka's heartily welcomed new participants from Beilstein, Ilsfeld and Hamburg.

Needless to say, training was not to be neglected during this week. Supported by his assistant instructors Jutta Fojkar (4th DAN) from Beilstein, Jürgen Marber (2nd DAN) and Uwe Leder (2nd DAN), both from Löchgau,

Shihan Athula Minithanthri (7th DAN) had prepared a varied training program for beginners and advanced learners alike.

On the first day of training the Chief Instructor made his students practise basic karate techniques (strikes, punches, blocks and kicks). He made sure that they carried out these basics correctly by employing their whole body in order to maximize the effectiveness of their techniques. He also compared Shitoryu techniques with Shotokan and Gojoryu techniques in order to give his students an overview of different Karate styles.

In the course of that week the karatekas learned two very complex katas (*Kushanku Sho & Chinte*) and also practised the kata moves in pairs (bunkai).

Theory lessons were dedicated to competition rules in order to prepare the karate students for tournaments. Daily lessons of practical self-defence were greeted with enthusiasm not only by the karatekas themselves, but also by many of their relatives. They were all very glad to get valuable instruction on how to defend themselves against everyday attacks (holding, beating, choking, knife) and practised the new defences relentlessly.

It was, by way of contrast, an amusing yet instructive lesson of "Aqua-Karate" that completed the training week on a humorous note. Standing in the lake with the water reaching their necks, Shihan Athula Minithanthri and his students practised their techniques under water, fighting the water pressure.

For the kids, however, the highlight of the week were Friday's newly instigated "Kids Olympics". Here, young karatekas aged 4 to 12 demonstrated their speed, endurance and flexibility. They were all very proud to receive medals and certificates naming them "Kid Karate Warriors".

Far from being boring even during spare time, Shitoryu Summercamp had a lot of interesting leisure activities to offer. Soaked with sweat after strenuous training, the karatekas went for a cooling swim in the lake or even learned windsurfing with Uwe Leder. But they also enjoyed calmer activities like trips over the Rhine to France, a "sandman"- program for younger and movies for older kids, or also music and singing with guitarist Jürgen Schwetz.

One evening, directed by Uta Baltus, the kids impersonated newsreaders and gave answers to questions that nobody has ever asked. Did you know how many calories there are in the glue on the back of a British stamp? (The answer is 5.7!) Friday evening's Sayonara-party with music and dancing crowned the week at Freizeitcenter Oberrhein.

Sure to meet again next summer, the karatekas and their families packed their tents on Saturday morning. In the end, all the participants were enthusiastic. To put it in a nutshell: Shitoryu summercamp is immensely valuable not only for the karatekas' progress in their sport, but also for the participants' social cohesion and friendship. This summer, it has become a tradition that will live on.
